Elevated Risk of Highly-Pathogenic Avian Influenza in 2021

North America has been pretty quiet for the last few years when it comes to Highly-Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI). But we have some early warning signs that we will be at a higher risk level in 2021. Avian disease analysts have been monitoring the pattern of spread of HPAI in Europe and Asia and report that the pattern this year is almost a perfect match for 2014, when HPAI was introduced into North America through migratory bird routes and tens of millions of birds from infected flocks were culled or succumbed to the virus.


The risk from the Pacific flyway is of particular concern to us due to the movement of people and products between Alberta and BC. Since migratory birds typically do not come into direct contact with commercial birds raised in closed barns, the primary risk is from tracking in the virus after coming into contact with feces from infected wild birds. An analysis of recent infections in Japanese farms indicated that in spite of heightened concern about HPAI in the area, the vast majority of farms that fell sick were due to people bringing it into the barns through biosecurity errors.


With migratory birds from infected areas set to arrive in North America, this is a good time to do a walk-around of the barns to check for damage to screens or structure that could be access points for birds or other potential disease vectors. More importantly, it's a good time to review your footwear changes and handwashing practices before going into your bird areas. As feces are a primary vector for disease spread, footwear changes and handwashing before entering your bird area are very important.

BC has raised their biosecurity alert status in anticipation of the arrival of migratory birds and the USDA has been holding information calls to alert the industry of the potential additional risk of HPAI in 2021. Analysis of HPAI movement among US poultry farms in 2014-2015 and now again from Japanese infections show humans are unfortunately a big part of disease spread.

There are numerous ways HPAI may find its way into your barn that are out of your control, but you have control over the biosecurity protocols for people and for equipment, so let's make extra sure to get that right in 2021 and hopefully the growing concerns can end up being a non-event.
