## Chicken Farmers of Canada's Young Farmers Program 2024-2025 - Now Accepting Applications

#### What is the Young Farmer's Program?

The Chicken Farmers of Canada's Young Farmer Program is a professional development program that teaches young leaders in the chicken sector about governance, succession planning and personal branding, while also getting to network with key agriculture and government stakeholders. It also helps young farmers better understand the sector and gives them the tools to succeed. Every year, five young farmers will be selected to participate in the 18-month program. We will have a distribution of candidates from across the country:

- One representative from the Atlantic Provinces
- One from Ontario
- One from Quebec
- Two from the Western provinces.



Young chicken farmers selected for this program will gain valuable experience by meeting other emerging leaders within the sector. Participants will also get to share their knowledge with policy makers and stakeholders within the agriculture sector. The Program will give young farmers the tools and training to continue growing in the industry, with the long-term goal of having them play a larger role in governing and promoting chicken farming in Canada.

## University of Calgary Faculty of Veterinary Medicine Announces the Opening of a new Serology Laboratory

The Diagnostic Services Unit (DSU) is very excited to announce that the new Serology laboratory section opens on Monday, October 16, 2023. We will initially receive Avian samples only for the following diseases: Newcastle disease virus (NDV), avian reovirus (REO), infectious bronchitis virus (IBV), avian encephalomyelitis (AE) and infectious bursal disease (IBD).

This milestone for further expansion of the DSU would not have been possible without the support and funding from the four Alberta Poultry Boards and we thank you for your ongoing support! We are excited to continue serving Alberta's production animal industry and strengthen veterinary diagnostics in Alberta.

Dr. Ashish Gupta (poultry pathologist) and Dr. Manga Devi (serology technician), both supported by the four Alberta Poultry Boards, have worked extensively to open the serology lab section to poultry clients. We are excited as they continue to develop and expand the service to other species and tests.

Please stay tuned for announcements regarding future testing and DSU expansion. Thank you again for your ongoing support.



#### A-187 and A-188 Allocation

On October 10, 2023 Chicken Farmers of Canada set allocation for A-187 & A-188

The national allocation for Period A-187 was set at 1.50% over adjusted base. Under the national allocation formula, Alberta's A-187 allocation is 1.40% over adjusted base.


