Alberta Chicken Producers Connect with Foodies, Culinary Leaders, and Future Chefs through Hot Chefs Cool bEATS Event

On May 2, 2024, Alberta Chicken Producers participated in the Hot Chefs Cool bEATS event, hosted at the PriMed Mosaic Centre in Edmonton. The fundraising event supported the Canadian Culinary Fund/High School Culinary Challenge program.

The evening showcased culinary delights from over 15 of Edmonton's top chefs, complemented by a selection of wine, craft beer, and spirits. All proceeds from ticket sales were donated to the scholarship program.

Alberta Chicken took center stage at several food stations helmed by local chefs:

- Edmonton Expo Centre, Chef Jiju Paul, presented a Mosaic chicken dish.
- El mero mero, Chef Alfonso Gutierrez, offered "El yucataco" (Pibil style): small tacos with chicken marinated in orange juice and pepper-spiced paste, served atop chipotle refried beans and garnished with pickled red onion, cilantro, and habanero sweet cream.
- NAIT, Chef Kelsey Johnson, presented a selection of Chicken and Pork Terrines with accompaniments, as well as Chicken liver mousse.
- Joey Restaurants, Chef Colin Fryer, served Blackened Chicken with warm potato salad and charred scallion oil.

A-191 Allocation

On May 29, 2024 Chicken Farmers of Canada set allocation for A-191.

- The national allocation for Period A-191 was set at 1.00% over adjusted base.
- Under the national allocation formula, which defaults to Pro-Rata if no growth, Alberta's A-191 allocation is 0.83% over adjusted base.
- Alberta's allocation for A-191, starts on August 25, 2024 and ends on October 19, 2024
